Motivated Youth Help Motivated Athletes

Unfortunately these items don't pack themselves. For the past four years a group of students in the Early Identification Program (EIP) have gathered at East Gate Hall in Marathon County Park to stuff over 30,000 pieces into 6,000 bags. This enthusiastic group brings with them more than their bright smiles; but a strong work ethic.

The Early Identification Program is a pre-college program for students sixth through twelfth grade and must be recommended to the program. To be eligible a student must demonstrate potential to be college bound. Through EIP, students are given opportunities to learn leadership skills, visit college campuses, attend workshops and receive academic advising. Volunteering is also a significant element of the program.

They donate their time to a variety of events within the Wausau community including Octobirdfest, Fill-A-Backpack, the Center for Visual Arts, bell ringing for the Salvation Army and babysitting for various community events.

The EIP group started volunteering for the Games with a handful of students. "I thought they would enjoy the activity because they could all work together," said Kathy Drury, Education Specialist with the program. "And the Games are an important part of the Wausau community."

It does not take much to motivate this ambitious youth group. From the moment they show up they are ready to go. Some go directly to their stations from the previous year and share instructions with those new to the task. The group continues to grow in size as the time filling the bags diminishes. The efficiency they bring to this activity allows the Games' staff to focus on other assignments. They work hard, challenge each other to work faster all while laughing and having a great time.

"It's always fun because you don't volunteer alone. You come with a bunch of friends and do it together," said Suese Xiong. "Not only that, you get to meet other volunteers as well."

Linda Vue stated, "I volunteer because I know it is a good thing to do for our community."

The Early Identification Program continues to provide opportunities for these students to advance themselves, it also nurtures the character the students already have. Their eager approach and amiable disposition are noteworthy.

The individual receiving the award this year goes to a participant, who has an intense passion for her sport and spends much of her time training and competing, but who also used her talent to unselfishly help someone away from her sport.

Katie B. Wilson, at the age of 11, is already an accomplished snowboarder seeking a podium spot at the USA Snowboard Association National Championships at Copper Colorado, but it is for her actions off the hill that she is being recognized as the 2009 Spirit of the Games Award winner.

After enrolling in a new school this fall, Katie became friends with a girl who, not unlike herself, enjoys being physically active. After a typical fall semester, her friend had an atypical doctor's appointment and found out she had cancer.

Katie felt heartbroken that her new friend was so sick and wanted to do something to make her feel better. She called upon the friends she's made through snowboarding from across the country of all ages. She decided to appeal to them on her friend's behalf.

Hi everyone!

I have been very sad the last couple of days. My friend Gina, went to the doctor for a regular well-check-up and found out she has cancer. She has two tumors, one just above her heart and one pushing on her trachea. She has been diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma. It is very sad and scary to think she was at my house for a Halloween party and a few weeks later she has cancer. (she is only 11 just like me)

Gina is very brave, and is my hero. She tries to find smiles when she can. The one thing she is really worried about is losing her hair. She starts chemo today. As many of you know I make snowboard hats, and yes I am making her one.... but she is so sad and worried about how she is going to look after she loses her hair. Just one hat isn't cool when you feel so yucky and lose your hair..... a girl needs CHOICES you know!

So I thought..... HEY.... Snowboarders have the BEST hats around! I want to make her smile and feel COOL again! So I need your help! I decided to start a hat drive for Gina! I am asking everyone I know to send me a hat. Gina is fighting for her life; I want her to feel cool and loved and not worry about her hair or how she looks. She is so pretty! So if you could help me with the hats that would really cheer her up!

BRIEF HISTORY

It started with the Wisconsin Amateur Sports Corporation, a nonprofit organization established in 1983 to foster amateur athletics in Wisconsin. Headed up by its Chairperson, Madison Mayor Joel Skornicka, the WASC submitted a proposal to the U.S. Olympic Committee that would have made Madison the host city for the 1987 National Sports Festival. Although the bid was unsuccessful, the enthusiasm and commitment to amateur athletes was so strong that the momentum resulted in the creation of the Badger State Games.

The first Badger State Games (Summer) took place July 12-14, 1985 under the auspices of the Wisconsin Amateur Sports Corporation. An Olympic-style, multi-sports festival—a unique sporting event that combined Olympic tradition with the spirit of Wisconsin to benefit the state's amateur athletes, the Badger State Games were endorsed by the U.S. Olympic Committee and became a member of the National Congress of State Games.

The purpose of the Badger State Summer Games, as stated in the 1985 Souvenir Program, was to:

- Provide Wisconsin citizens of all ages and skill levels a wholesome avenue for positive personal development through sports and physical activity
- Provide a source of recognition for amateur athletes
- Enable all Wisconsin residents to utilize quality sports facilities provided in their capital city and in their own community
- Create an amateur sports network of administrators and volunteers throughout Wisconsin to further the development of grassroots amateur athletic programs

THE BREITENBACH ERA (1988-98)

Otto Breitenbach was a major figure in stabilizing and rooting the Badger State Games. He came to the Games in 1988 after 14 years as Assistant Athletic Director for the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He expanded the Games statewide through regional competitions and **developed the Winter Games**, which first took place in 1989. Breitenbach was committed to fulfilling the mission of the Games and took great satisfaction in providing activities that developed wellness, health and well being for all Wisconsinites. Breitenbach retired in 1997, and a special award in his name was created and is given annually to individuals who carry on his spirit of the Games.

BSG TRIVIA

- The first Badger State Winter Games took place in 1989, over 1,600 athletes participated in four sports; Alpine Skiing, Nordic Skiing, Curling, Figure Skating and Hockey.
- The first Winter Games featured a Torch Run, which started in Madison January 5th. The torch traveled the state and arrived in Wausau for the first opening ceremony February 3, 1989.
- The Badger State Games registered its 100,000th athlete in 1992.
- In 1995 Corie Berrigan, 32, Green Bay, a downhill skier and mountain biker and Herb Howe, 83, Madison, a masters swimmer, were the first individuals to be named "Athletes of the Year." Governor Tommy Thompson awarded them the designation in an April ceremony at the State Capitol Building
- Medal winners at the Games are invited to participate in the State Games of America (SGA). The next SGA will take place in 2009, in Colorado Springs. Visit www.stategames.org for additional information.
